

HANDICRAFT

Steward: Wallumbilla Craft Group

Entry Fee: \$1:00

All entries must be presented to the pavilion along with nomination forms before **12 midday on Friday 3rd May, 2019** no late entries accepted.

All entries are to be new, the work of the competitor and not previously entered in the Wallumbilla Show. Synthetic yarns are acceptable but if entries are judged equal in quality, then pure wool or wool blend has preference. Stewards have the right to enter an item into a different category if deemed necessary.

Definitions:

- Garment is only one item
- For example in knitting and crocheting – a jumper, beanie, scarf are garments. A layette is not as it has more than one piece – could use the jacket as a garment.
- For example in sewing – a blouse, skirt, dress, pants are a garment but a skirt and top together is an outfit and could be entered as two separate entries.
- **Novice** is someone over 15 who hasn't won a prize in the handicraft section prior to 2019 (not including prizes won in Junior Section)

2. Article in fine crochet – number 40 or over
3. Article in course crochet
4. Article or garment – crochet using no more than 100 grams of wool

8. Any article knitted not previously listed
9. Any article crocheted not previously listed

24. Article in patchwork using three techniques (eg: applique, embroidery, patchwork piecing)
